



Yorkshire Water

The new offices at Livingstone House on the River Aire waterfront in the centre of Leeds are the manifestation of Byzak's appointment as one of seven contractor partners to assist with the water company's £1.35 billion AMP5 programme 2010-2015.

Byzak has appointed Entec UK as its design partner and the ByzakEntec team (BZE) will be headed by Framework Manager Andy Laundon. Byzak last worked for Yorkshire Water in 1997, so this new appointment is an important development for the company.

The Leeds office is home to the 500 strong Asset Delivery Unit staffed by contractors and Yorkshire Water. BZE has responsibility for a £100 million stream of water and sewage treatment projects.

The first work batches are refurbishment of water treatment work around Keighley and Bradford, and drainage investigations at Scarborough.

The Chellow Heights WTW Bradford project includes new chemical dosing systems and includes refurbishment of the 6no 26 metre diameter clarifier tanks, and 14no rapid gravity filters.

Scottish Water



The Water Authority has appointed Byzak as a Capital Delivery Partner (CDP) for each of three lots for the period 2010 - 2016 forming its Quality & Standards capital investment programme (Q&S3b);

- Lot 1 - Non Infrastructure
- Lot 2 - Infrastructure
- Lot 3 - Capital Maintenance

Works within the frameworks involve the design and construction of works associated with water and wastewater

treatment, capital maintenance to treatment works, networks, reservoirs and pumping stations.

The works will include all civil engineering, process, mechanical, electrical, telemetry, control and instrumentation works as required. It is envisaged that a significant volume of work under Lots 1 and 2 will be undertaken on a design and build basis. Lot 3 Capital Maintenance Framework replaces the Small Value Capital Framework and related programmes, which Byzak has been delivering since 2004.

Byzak continues to consolidate its position as a leading multi-disciplinary contractor to the UK water industry for the north of England and Scotland.

United Utilities

Byzak has also been awarded a two year extension to the current Minor Works Alliance Framework with United Utilities taking the agreement to 2012.

The workload continues to be civil and M&E works at treatment works and reservoirs. A recent £135,000 scheme at Bolton WwTW involved the installation of two grit transfer ram pumps. The above ground installation, replacing old pumps located within a confined space and a pipework system which suffered repeated blockages, provides UU with both health & safety and efficiency improvements.



Northumbrian Water

The three current AMP4 Framework Agreements for water & sewage treatment (Major Works), Design & Construct (Minor Works) and Pumping Station Refurbishment run to 2011. Northumbrian Water are assessing applications, including those from Byzak, for the AMP5 period to 2015.
